This award will be implemented over the 18-county region of the Region-3 Healthcare Coalition Alliance. Staff provided a detailed overview of the anticipated workplan, as well as discussed expected steps moving forward.

Infectious Disease Planning

HCC staff has begun work on infectious disease planning and mitigation through a grant received by the Florida Hospital Association. Soon, members will begin to receive surveys to assist the HHC to develop training needs assessments and supply chain assessments. These activities will be followed by planning workshops to assist with identifying a regional infectious disease implementation strategy.
