# General Membership Meeting June 15, 2022 @ 1pm Meeting Notes

The June General Membership Meeting of the Northeast Florida Healthcare Coalition was held inperson and via Zoom teleconference technology. A hybrid meeting was held due to COVID-19 precautions. The meeting commenced at 1:00 pm on Wednesday, June 15, 2022.

## **CALL TO ORDER**

The meeting was called to order by Leigh Wilsey with a validation of members, with the following Executive Board members present. Quorum was met for voting.

### \*Approval of Minutes

The draft minutes from April 20, 2022, and May 18, 2022, Executive Board Meeting was provided as part of the meeting packet.

The Chair called for a motion. A motion was made to approve the draft minutes by Dave Chapman (Hospitals). A second was made by John Blanchard (Emergency Management). Motion carries.

## **FINANCIAL**

#### \*Budget Report

The finance report for May 2022 was presented by Leigh Wilsey.

The Chair called for a motion. A motion was made to approve the financial report by Jose Morales

(Baker). A second was made by Dave Chapman (Hospitals). Motion carries.

#### **Expenditure Requests**

No expenditure requests at this time.

#### Management and Administration

- **Final expenditures:** Staff report wrapping up final purchases that do not need Board approval. Report they are purchasing training materials such as projectors. Staff reiterates the redirection of funds from a canceled CHAMP project to a Northeast facility that was discussed last month.
- New Contract with FDOH: Staff report recently receiving their new contract from FDOH. Staff is still reviewing the contract and planning for the upcoming year; report there has been an increase in funding.
- Year-end Review and Plans for Next Year: Wrapping up contract year 21-22, the Alliance provided about 35 trainings with 430 attendees, and was able to fund, along with FHA, approximately \$261,000 on member projects/equipment. Planning for next year, there will be more engagement with marketing and member retention processes. For training, planning for NIMS, HICS & NHICS, Active Assailant, and EOP/COOP plan writing workshops. For exercises, planning for Pediatric Surge tabletop, Radiation Surge tabletop, and CMS Compliant tabletop. This next year the Alliance is also planning to sponsor members to attend EMAG in Sayannah.
  - Active Assailant training: John Coffey asked staff about the Jacksonville Sheriff's Office's role in this type of training/exercise, said that in previous talks JSO has said they could not participate, because they could not spare the staff. Staff explained they cannot fund a facility-specific exercise, but they are looking into training opportunities where multiple facilities can participate. Dave Chapman explained FEMA has training online for individuals and facilities to combat the stress and angst amongst hospital staff right now. Staff asked members if an Active Assailant reference/resource toolkit would be useful for facilities.
  - Dave Chapman discussed that CMS has rule changes for facilities for EOPs and more guidance to come to update.

## **BUSINESS**

### \*Approval of General Membership Requests

As required in the bylaws, the Board must approve all membership requests. There have been nine (9) membership requests since the last meeting. The list was provided in the meeting packet.

The Chair called for a motion. A motion was made by Dave Chapman (Hospitals) to approve the new members. A second was made by Jose Morales (Baker). Motion carries.

#### \*Final Plan Approvals

Staff report they received valuable feedback and comments on all the plans sent out to the Membership. Staff integrated all the appropriate changes to the documents and thanked the members who took the time to provide a thorough review.

The Chair called for a motion. A motion was made by Jose Morales (Baker) to approve the new members. A second was made by Lawana Jolivette (Hospitals). Motion carries.

## **TRAINING AND EXERCISES**

#### Stress First Aid

Staff reported over the past two weeks, 25 people across the State and 3 people within the Alliance received Stress First Aid train-the-trainer, training. These individuals can now provide Stress First Aid training to members and facilities. More to come on future train-the-trainer offerings <a href="Tania Glenn - Virtual Training: Resiliency Through Chaos">Tania Glenn - Virtual Training: Resiliency Through Chaos</a>

First Coast Disaster Council and the Alliance are sponsoring a virtual presentation by Dr. Tania Glenn. The flyer is attached to the meeting packet, please follow the link to register. The presentation is on June 21<sup>st</sup> at 11:00 AM.

#### MRSE Exercise – June 23 (partnering with FCDC)

Next week is the MRSE exercise following the FCDC meeting on June 23<sup>rd</sup>. This exercise will surge the Duval County hospital and bring key stakeholders to the table to discuss processes if this event ever did occur.

## **OPEN DISCUSSION**

• Hospitals – Dave Chapman reported the After Action Report (AAR) presented by Eric Anderson to the First Coast Disaster Council (FCDC) on COVID-19 mitigation specifically on the Delta variant, was well received. Reported the Joint Commission representative met with the hospitals and was impressed by the collaboration between FCDC and the Healthcare Coalition, and other local stakeholders. Reports nothing is pressing at the hospital at the moment, planning training events for the fall.

FCDC meeting will be next Thursday, June 23<sup>rd</sup> at 10:30 AM.

Lawana Jolivette discussed the number of new people working at facilities and the aspect of working from home, and the importance of these employees knowing the reporting process for injuries. Recommended facilities make sure their employees know the procedure to report injuries/hospitalizations to the facility, and for managers to know how to report this to OSHA.

• Public Health – Robert Snyder reported that the COVID-19 variant 2.12.1 is very contagious which has caused the uptick in cases over the last 5-6 weeks. Report they are seeing a slight increase in hospital admissions; they believe the variant reached its peak last week. Report the health departments are watching the Omicron 4 and 5 variants that are in Africa and Europe and expect the variants to hit the United States end of summer and beginning of fall. State their health department is working on training their new employees on the processes for special needs sheltering, in preparation for hurricane season.

DOH Duval – Closing their last testing/vaccination POD at Joseph Lee Center at the end of

June. Vaccinations will be routed to the South Jacksonville Immunization clinic and Pearl Immunization clinic. They will continue home-bound vaccination visits, along with many outreach vaccination events. Testing will be absorbed within the community.

- Supply Chain Issues Robert Snyder reported shortage of infant formula is still pressing and getting dire for mothers; the health departments are trying to fill gaps as much as possible. Jose Morales reports they cannot get in "M" and "E" oxygen tanks, shipment has been delayed until 2023.
- Monkeypox An informational presentation on Monkeypox will be sent to the membership, provided by Robert Snyder through FDOH. Sandi Courson reports the State lab in Jacksonville is doing Monkeypox testing, facility labs need to know how to properly label and package the specimens to be sent to the State lab.
- Long-Term Care Nothing to report.
- EMS No updates. Last meeting was canceled.
- Emergency Management Nothing to report.
- Home Health Nothing to report.
