# General Membership Meeting April 19, 2023 @ 1pm Meeting Notes

#### \*Approval of Minutes

#### Management and Administration

#### EMAG 2023 Recap

18 individuals from across the three HCCs in the Alliance attended the EMAG conference in Savannah last week, April 12-14<sup>th</sup>. All attendees reported enjoying the various breakout sessions. The conference also provided the opportunity for different members to interact with members of other Coalitions. EMAG continues to be an advantageous conference for Coalition members.

#### **Project Funding Update**

Staff reports all but two projects have received their equipment. Two Marion County projects are procuring their equipment but remain on track to submit for reimbursement prior to the end of the fiscal year. All other projects have submitted their reimbursement paperwork or are in the process of submitting their paperwork.

#### **PRESENTATIONS**

#### Bold Planning Presentation – Will Minkoff

Mr. Will Minkoff from BOLDplanning presented to the meeting attendees on who and what BOLDplanning is, and what services will be offered through the Coalition's funding/contractual agreement with the company. BOLDplanning provides a software platform for any agency or organization to develop a COOP plan. As planning workshops are scheduled, the HCC staff will distribute that information to all members.

CDBG: North Florida Resiliency Plan for Health and Medical Lifeline – Eric Anderson Mr. Eric Anderson, from the Northeast Florida Regional Council, provided a presentation regarding the work being done on CDBG: North Florida Resiliency Plan for Health and Medical Lifeline. This program evaluates several climate exposures on the healthcare facilities in the 18-county region of the Region 3 Healthcare Coalition Alliance. As this program moves forward, program staff will begin local workshops to discuss with stakeholders what their threats are based on the hazards being evaluated within this grant. UF Health Jacksonville has agreed to be the pilot facility to understand what their footprint specific climate exposure is. As this program progresses, staff will survey the HCC membership twice; one time on infrastructure impacts and the second survey will evaluate the impacts on the healthcare delivery system from the findings of the analysis.

#### **BUSINESS**

#### \*Approval of General Membership Requests

As required in the bylaws, the Board must approve all membership requests. There have been two (2) membership requests since the last meeting. The list was provided in the meeting packet.

The Chair called for a motion. A motion was made by Dave Chapman (Hospitals) to approve the new members. A second was made by Sonny Rodgers (Clay County). Motion carries.

#### **Board Nominations**

Staff report there are several vacancies for voting members; St. Johns County is missing one representative and Long-Term Care is missing a representative. Staff urge these respective

positions to contact their appointing body. Voting members are now eligible to send in their nominations for Board Officer positions. Currently, Mr. Tim Devin sits as the Chair, and Mr. Dave Chapman serves as the Vice Chair. Mr. Jeff Markulik was serving as the Secretary/Treasurer, prior to his retirement. Per the bylaws, the Chair, Vice Chair, and Secrtary/Treasurer can serve two consecutive terms, and currently Mr. Devin and Mr. Chapman are on their first term. Following the survey, there will be voting at the May meeting.

#### **HVA Gaps Project**

The Alliance Board has identified pre-hospital pediatric surge management to be a prioritized, regional gap. The State has approved the Coalition's request to use the additional HVA gap funding to purchase equipment to help fill this regional gap. Staff are collecting each county's needs to determine the number of pieces of equipment needed to be ordered. As soon as this is identified, staff will begin the purchasing process.

#### TRAINING AND EXERCISE

#### Active Threat Virtual TTX Offerings

Two offerings of an active threat virtual tabletop exercise will be provided through the Coalition on May 8<sup>th</sup> and May 16<sup>th</sup>. Both offerings will be from 1:00 to 4:30 PM. The training flyer and registration information was shared with Coalition members through ReadyOp and it is posted on the Alliance website. As of now, the first offering is full, and there are only a few seats open in the second offering.

#### Statewide Radiation Surge Tabletop Exercise

In partnership with the State and the HCCs across the state, there will be a virtual, tabletop exercise on May 17<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 AM to 1:00 PM, to test the new Alliance Radiation Surge Annex. This statewide exercise will provide the opportunity for regional breakout groups for each region to talk about their threats, capabilities, and gaps. There will be statewide report-outs, to see how different regions would respond, following the regional breakout. The flyer and registration have been shared through email and is posted to the Alliance website.

#### PER-320 Course

Staff report they have finalized with TEEX the dates and registration links for this course delivery. It is a full-day, in-person training. Individuals who attend this will train on PPE, with donning and doffing and other considerations during a biological event. The course flyer with more information and registration links will be attached to the meeting minutes and is on the Alliance website. Staff encourage members to share this training opportunity, as if there are not 26 registrants in each offering, they will not provide the training.

#### Pediatric Surge TTX

Staff shared the upcoming, in-person pediatric surge tabletop exercise opportunity to be held on July 25, 2023, from 12:30 to 4:00 PM. The exercise is geared towards ESF-8 partners – public health, hospitals, EMS, emergency management, etc. The *Save the Date* has been shared with the Alliance membership. The exercise is projected to be hosted at the FDLE building in Jacksonville, updated information will be shared with the Alliance once it is received by staff.

#### **OPEN DISCUSSION**

• Hospitals – Mr. Dave Chapman reported the 15 'Til 50 exercise is scheduled for June 6th and

7<sup>th</sup> at St. Vincent's Southside. June 6<sup>th</sup> is the training/walk-through in the afternoon, and the exercise will be on the morning of June 7<sup>th</sup>. The next FCDC meeting is Thursday, April 27<sup>th</sup> and it will be virtual only.

Ms. Jenn Silvey-Cason is now the President of FCDC, and she reports the next several FCDC meetings will be virtual until they can find a new meeting space.

#### • Public Health

- Clay FDOH Mr. Sonny Rodgers reports they should have a new planner on board by May 1<sup>st</sup>. May 15-19<sup>th</sup> they are working with Clay County Emergency Management during Hurricane Preparedness Week, working with all local partners. Clay DOH has an upcoming training with the Regional Special Needs Coordinator, to train all special needs shelter staff. More information to come on their back-to-school event.
- Baker FDOH Mr. Jose Morales asks HCC staff if there was a way for meeting attendees
  to receive an email confirmation once an attendee has signed-in through the ReadyOp
  form. Reports in May, Baker DOH is having an all-staff training for special needs
  sheltering operations. Reports they are working with several locations regarding COOP
  locations within Baker County.
- Regional FDOH Ms. Freda Vaughn reports the Region 2 RERA, Sam MacDonnell is retiring, and his last working day is next Friday. Reports there will be a retirement celebration in Tallahassee on May 18<sup>th</sup>.
   Reports she will be out of town the first two weeks of May. During the first week, the Region 2 RERA, Howell Batts, will be covering Region 3. During the second week, the Region 5 RERA will cover for Region 3.
- Long-Term Care Nothing to report.
- EMS Mr. Tim Devin reports at the last EMS meeting they discussed the new allocations of rural versus non-rural counties, and how that may impact future funding and grant opportunities for EMS agencies.
- Emergency Management Nothing to report.
- Home Health Nothing to report.

# **FEMA SID Guide**

# **FEMA Student Identification (SID)**

#### What is a FEMA SID?

FEMA Student Identification (SID) number is a unique number generated and assigned to anyone who needs or is required to take training provided by a FEMA organization. Your FEMA SID uniquely identifies you throughout the FEMA organization and all of its agencies. The goal is for your FEMA SID to serve as your personal identification number instead of your Social Security Number (SSN) in support of FEMA's effort to decrease/cease the use of SSN for identifying and tracking individuals.

## Why do I need a FEMA SID?

A FEMA SID is required to register for and participate in any training provided by FEMA. All FEMA training providers' registration systems and enrollment procedures require a valid FEMA SID. The FEMA SID will serve as your unique identifier and be used to maintain the record of FEMA training you attended.

# Do you have a FEMA Student Identification (SID) Number?

To register, go to the <u>FEMA Student Identification System</u>
Select "Register for a FEMA SID" in the middle of the screen. Follow the instructions and provide the necessary information to create your account. If you are a user with a Personal Identity Verification (PIV) card, enter your FEMA SID and select your certificate and enter your pin.

## Forgot your FEMA SID?

If you already have a FEMA SID but forgot it, go to the <u>FEMA Student</u>
<u>Identification System</u> and select the option: "Forgot Your FEMA SID." You will be asked to provide certain information. Your FEMA SID will be emailed to you along with a separate message that will ask you to reset your password.
